Racing culture takes center stage in Shanghai with F1 Chinese Grand Prix

Dozens of racing car-themed and culture-related activities are hosted this month in downtown Shanghai as well as suburban Jiading District, where the Formula One Heineken Chinese Grand Prix 2025 just concluded over the weekend.

Jointly organized by the Shanghai municipal government, the Jiading District government, and a number of cultural and sports venues, including Shanghai Museum, Shanghai Grand Theater, Shanghai Urban Planning Exhibition Center and Shanghai Sports Museum, the series of events is partly hosted to leverage the iconic city center landmarks to promote Jiading's cultural brands, tourist attractions, sports and cultural resources, and its business environment. It is also a successful initiative to create synergy between Jiading's Yuanxiang Lake Culture Loop and the People's Square Culture Loop downtown.
